

Fire & Lockdown Procedures

In the event of a fire or evacuation, a continuous alarm will sound. All staff, students, volunteers and visitors should calmly leave the building by the designated exists and proceed to the assembly point on the playground at the rear of the school. Visitors will be escorted to the assembly point by their host.

In the case of specific threat that requires the building to be secured – a lockdown will be initiated, and a longer intermittent alarm will be triggered. All visitors should ensure they lock/secure the space they are in and place themselves out of site as best possible. The end of a lockdown will be determined by the fire alarm.

Health and Safety

We strongly believe that it is everyone's responsibility and duty to report faults and hazards to someone in authority. If you notice something that causes concern, or if you have any first aid requirements, please notify a member of the site team or main reception.

Prevent

Anti-bullying

Vista Academy Littleport actively promotes respectful relationships and seeks to ensure that all students feel safe and secure in school. Incidents of bullying are rare, but any concerns should be reported to a member of staff.

Smoking / Vaping

Vista Academy Littleport is strictly a no smoking site. Smoking is prohibited throughout the site, including the grounds. This also applies to the use of vapes.

SAFEGUARDING

- General visitors will be issued with a **red** lanyard and those with safeguarding checks in place will be issued with a **black** lanyard.
- If you have any concerns about a student during the academy day you must fill in a "Safeguarding log of concern" sheet (known as a **Pink Form**)
- These are available at Reception
- Immediately return the form to Reception for the attention of the Designated Safeguarding Lead
